

Helsinki – the Baltic pearl

Day 1: Arrive in Helsinki by air

Individual arrival by air to Helsinki. Transfer to the hotel and overnight.

Day 2: Helsinki

Breakfast.

Helsinki is a modern cultural city surrounded by the sea and its own exotic archipelago and offers visitors an endless number of possibilities.

Guided tour of Helsinki will take you to the most important and interesting parts of Helsinki, such as the historical centre and the diplomatic quarters, Senate Square, the Presidential Palace, City Hall, the Parliament building, Finlandia Hall and the Opera House. You will stop at Senate Square, the Sibelius Monument which is dedicated to the Finnish composer Jean Sibelius (1865–1957). The monument is located at the Sibelius Park and, when possible, Temppeliaukio Church. The Temppeliaukio church is one of the most popular tourist attractions in the city; half a million people visit it annually. The stone-hewn church is located in the heart of Helsinki. Maintaining the original character of the square is the fundamental concept behind the building. The idiosyncratic choice of form has made it a favorite with professionals and aficionados of architecture.

Overnight.

Day 3: Helsinki

Breakfast.

You will do a short boat trip to the islands just outside Helsinki Center where you will visit one of the largest maritime fortresses in the world. Suomenlinna is a historical monument for Finland and Helsinki and here you will get a guided tour as well as a visit to the museum to see how it actually looked one day. After some interesting time here you will return to the Salutorget in Helsinki by boat.

The afternoon is at leisure. Overnight.

Day 4: Leaving Helsinki

Breakfast. Transfer to the airport.
